Using Walking Speed to Classify Individuals as Household vs Community Ambulators

| Walking Speed | Classification | Description of Ability Level |
|----------------------|-----------------------------------|--|
| <0.40 m/s | Household ambulator | Ranges from requiring wheelchair for bathroom and bedroom mobility to being able to use walking for all household activities but encounters difficulty with stairs and uneven terrain and needs at least supervision for both entering/exiting the house and managing curbs. |
| 0.40 to <0.80 m/s | Limited community ambulator | Ranges from being independent (without supervision) in either entering/exiting the home or managing curbs; requires some assistance in both local store and uncrowded shopping centres to being able to perform without assistance (but may need supervision) in one of the following: local stores or uncrowded shopping centres. |
| ≥0.80 m/s | Community ambulator | Independent in all home and moderate community activities; can accept uneven terrain; and can negotiate a crowded shopping centre with supervision only. |
