## Using Walking Speed to Classify Individuals as Household vs Community Ambulators

| Walking Speed | Classification | Description of Ability Level |

| $<0.40 \mathrm{~m} / \mathrm{s}$ | Household <br> ambulator | Ranges from requiring wheelchair for bathroom and <br> bedroom mobility to being able to use walking for all <br> household activities but encounters difficulty with <br> stairs and uneven terrain and needs at least <br> supervision for both entering/exiting the house and <br> managing curbs. |
| 0.40 to | Limited <br> community <br> ambulator | Ranges from being independent (without supervision) <br> in either entering/exiting the home or managing curbs; <br> requires some assistance in both local store and <br> uncrowded shopping centres to being able to perform <br> without assistance (but may need supervision) in one <br> of the following: local stores or uncrowded shopping <br> centres. |
| $\geq 0.80 \mathrm{~m} / \mathrm{s}$ | Community <br> ambulator | Independent in all home and moderate community <br> activities; can accept uneven terrain; and can <br> negotiate a crowded shopping centre with <br> supervision only. |
